OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Minneola USD 219 consists of 292 square miles located at the intersection of Highways 54 and 283. The district's location is 22 miles south of Dodge City and 151 miles west of Wichita.

Minneola is home of the Minneola Wildcats! It is a 1A school and a member of the SPAA-Iroquois League. The community has a population of approximately 800 people.

Patrons are involved in farming and agricultural businesses as well as several small businesses including a bank, grocery store, pharmacy, and insurance agency. Medical services include a hospital, clinic, and a long-term care facility with four full-time doctors with additional quality staff and specialists which come weekly and/or monthly. Other patrons work in surrounding communities. In recent years, two Wind Farms have been established both to the North and South of our community. Both contribute financially to the community including the school.

The district's patrons are hard-working and support their local school through attendance and participation in school and community-sponsored events. Our school is a place where students come to learn, and instructors can teach in a favorable learning environment.

A walking track is located south of the school with a nice playground addition safely located away from the highways. The community also has a swimming pool. Our Recreation Commission offers activities for our youngsters in football, volleyball, and basketball.
