OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Centre USD 397 consists of 400 square miles nestled on the western fringe of the Flint Hills of Kansas. The district's location is ideally located about an hour's drive from the center of several larger cities including Salina, Manhattan Emporia and Wichita.

The K-12 attendance center is located on a 25-acre tract off Highway 77, two miles north of Lincolnville. Most of the district patrons are involved in farming and ranching or services that are related to the agricultural business community.

More than 95% of the students reside over 2.5 miles from the school and utilize district bus service. An extensive transportation system is required since the majority of students reside on farmsteads that surround the six communities that make up Centre: Lincolnville, Lost Springs, Burdick, Ramona, Pilsen and Tampa that are located in Marion, Morris, Dickinson and Chase counties.

The district's patrons are hard-working and support their local school through attendance and participation in school and community-sponsored events. Great pride is taken in the collaborative relationship that has developed during the past 50+ years and remains on-going among the six communities and the school. Our school is a place where students come to learn, and instructors can teach in a favorable learning environment.
