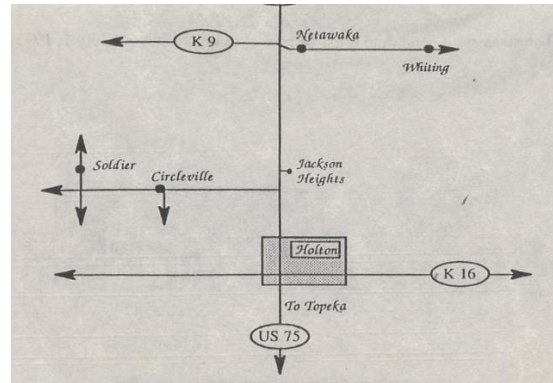

DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS

North Jackson is a rural district and is located 35 miles north of Topeka, Kansas. USD 335 is a 1A school district serving approximately 367 PK-12 students. The district covers approximately 225 square miles located in four northeast counties, the majority being in Jackson County. The school was built on an abandoned missile site purchased from the federal government.

Special education services are provided by Holton Special Education Coop. It is an education service agency under the governing bodies of 5 school districts in northeast Kansas. Each school district has the ability to provide services uniquely by offering occupational, physical, speech and language therapy along with a gifted and preschool program.
