- Three- and four-year-old special education program combined with our Early Learning Kansans (4-year-old atrisk) program
- Fee free all-day full curriculum kindergarten program
- Qualifying students are eligible for Special Education programs from three years of age up to 21
- After school tutoring is available in most buildings
- Dual credit and release college classes are available through Neosho County Community College, Johnson County Community College and Baker University
- Dual credit courses for vocational programs are available through Washburn Tech, The Eudora Technical Education Center and NCCC Ottawa campus
- Several in-house career pathway programs available at the high school
- On-line dual credit courses through our virtual school
- All schools have received accreditation from the KSDE
- District has begun a five-year process of accreditation through the KSDE called the Kansas Educational Systems Accreditation (KESA)

Baldwin City is traditionally dedicated to youth and education. Programs for all ages, preschool to adult are available.
