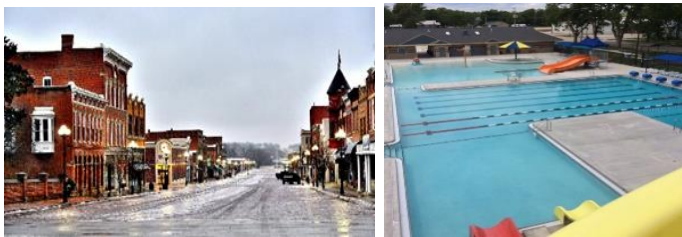
USD 364 CORE BELIEFS
