DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS

The school district has an extensive technology department with a one-to-one initiative for all students from Pre-K through 12th grade.

The high school and junior high are both members of the Heart of America League which supports and promotes academic and athletic programs for the tenmember school districts.

The Sedgwick athletics program includes numerous achievements, including the 2020-2021 State 2-1A Baseball Champions, 2021-2022 high school volleyball league champions/sub-state runners-up and 2021-2022 high school football sub-state runners-up.

Successful Bond Issue: The USD 439 community passed a 13.8-million-dollar bond on August 31. The construction project includes a library/media center, administrative offices for R.L. Wright Elementary, a physical education building (auxiliary gym, weight room/storm shelter, walking track), a surfaced track, and building renovations. Construction is set to begin in the spring of 2022.

OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITY

The City of Sedgwick was incorporated in 1872. One of the oldest communities in south central Kansas, Sedgwick's older neighborhoods are made up of treelined streets with a blend of homes. There are stately century-old homes, Craftsman style bungalows and small cottages. Two newer housing additions, located on the east end of town include modern ranch-style homes in family friendly neighborhoods.

Sedgwick is in the southern part of Harvey County just 15 minutes north of Wichita - close to the metroplex, but far enough away to hold a distinctive country charm. The community itself is home to a population of 1,600 residents. Although the city is barely one mile square, the district is 42 square miles. Prime shopping is just 20 minutes away and local businesses offer the necessities or a good meal close to home.

There are several churches in town and in surrounding communities. Quality care for citizens needing assistance is provided by Diversicare Healthcare & Rehabilitation Center and Wickridge apartments, which provides housing for those on a fixed income. Sundance - Sedgwick, a senior housing complex, is also available.

The Sedgwick Recreation Commission provides extracurricular activities as well as operating a community exercise and wellness center.
