DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS

The district has approximately 650 students in preschool through 12th grade. These students are educated in three distinct buildings. Lakin Elementary serves students in pre-k through 4th grade. Lakin Middle School serves students in grades 5-8, while Lakin High School serves students in grades 9-12. With 183 students, Lakin High School is in class 2A for KSHSAA activities.

USD 215 has maintained excellent instructional facilities with an exceptional amount of classroom space at all buildings. Recent improvements include a remodeled auditorium and an artificial turf football field. Students in Lakin High School benefit from a 1:1 laptop initiative while students in pre-k through 8th grade are close to 1:1 with iPads. All teachers are issued a laptop and an iPad.

USD 215 students are some of the finest youngsters in the state. Fifty-two percent of students qualify for free or reduced lunch, 35 % are designated as ESL, 15% are migrant and 100% are amazing kids.

Special Education services are provided in conjunction with the High Plains Special Education Coop. The district offers multiple dual credit opportunities through Garden City Community College and a growing number of CTE pathways.

USD 215 offers a competitive salary schedule with a base of \$42,000 in addition to a benefits package that pays for a full single Blue Cross/Blue Shield health insurance and part of a family plan as well. A district cell phone plan is available that provides unlimited service and phone replacement every two years.

The staff of USD 215 is a good mix of experienced teachers and staff members who bring expertise, stability, and an understanding of the community along with a fine group of young, energetic educators focused on improving their skills and building relationships with students. The administrative team is experienced, student centered and learning focused. All teachers and principals are trained in Kagan Cooperative Learning techniques and focused on engaging students in rigorous learning. As a Gemini II redesign school, the staff is universally focused on project-based learning as a cornerstone for instruction and a culture of continuous improvement.

OUR SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Lakin USD 215 is in Kearny County in Southwest Kansas. Lakin has a lot to offer. Small class sizes, a great support staff, small town living with great, local health care, wonderful community support, the list goes on and on. In addition, Garden City is 25 miles away, offering the bigger city amenities. Lakin is a great place to live and raise a family.
