OUR COMMUNITY

Onaga is a small town of about 700 people, nestled in the rolling Flint Hills of Kansas that sits along the waters of the Vermillion River. A great school system and the City is located within 50 miles of either Topeka or Manhattan. Located in northern Pottawatomie County, Onaga is a perfect example of small-town revitalization. With new water and sewer lines, a recently completed streetscape and high-performance fiber to the home, Onaga is perfectly positioned for growth. The Onaga Area Chamber of Commerce serves the Onaga, Havensville and Wheaton area.

Onaga is home to First Trust of Onaga, which provides non-discretionary custodial services on self-directed IRA, and personal custodial accounts, with more than 27,000 accounts and \$2 billion under its custody.

Onaga is also home to Community HealthCare System, a finalist for the Governor's Business of the Year Award, which employs more than 450 associates at seven locations serving a 10,000 square mile service area. The community is also home to a new, high-quality grocery store, and new hospital (currently under construction).

The Onaga Historical Society is proud of its museum complex with the various collections of antiques and other interesting items and displays from the area. In addition to a large Morton building and a small building full of memorabilia of Onaga and the surrounding area, there is an authentic log cabin, a one-room country schoolhouse and a Union Pacific train caboose for your touring enjoyment. A variety of resources are also available for those interested in doing family genealogy research. Admission is free; however free-will donations are appreciated.
