Garden City Public Schools USD 457 is a comprehensive early childhood through 12th grade public school system. It is the 9th largest school district in Kansas, which covers approximately 928 square miles. The district is considered a most progressive school system and has perhaps the most unique ethnic/racial student mixture of any school. The district has a long history of community support.

To accomplish our mission of "Quality Learning – Responsible Citizens," Garden City Public Schools offers a strong basic academic program. We also provide opportunities for a broad range of elective course work, as well as a full slate of extracurricular activities and experiences.
