DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS

USD 360 serves approximately 265 students from Preschool to 12th grade. The district provides preschool classes for three- and four-year-old students. The district has alternative education programs as well as operating a 6-12 virtual school. College credit classes are offered on-site, online, virtually, or students are transported to the campus to take part in accredited programs. The district is in the Kansas Can Redesign process as a Gemini II school district. The district received KESA accreditation at the end of their first five-year cycle in June of 2021.

COMMUNITY INFORMATION

The community of Caldwell is located on Kansas Highway 49 and US Highway 81 in south central Kansas. It is 55 miles south and west of Wichita and 15 miles west of Interstate 35 in southern Sumner county. The city started as a stop on the historic Chisholm Trail and became a gateway to the Cherokee Strip Land Run. The community is proud of its heritage and of their schools.

The town of 963 supports a medical clinic, with two nurse APRN, a dentist, a new critical access hospital, EMT services, two banks, a new swimming pool and splash pad, a lumber yard/hardware store, parts store, a farmers cooperative, a body shop, a grocery store, several eating establishments, and is the headquarters of KanOkla Networks which provides internet to the school district and homes via direct fiber optic lines.
