## DISTRICT HIGHLIGHTS

- Primary houses our Rocket Launch Program, this program includes students that are 3 & 4 years old. These students are either fee based, grant qualifiers, or have early childhood special education needs
- Rocket Launch & ECSE are significant programming for Rose Hill USD 394
- Early Childhood Program of the 3- & 4-year-old classes mirror the Kindergarten schedule and has been at max capacity since it opened
- Elementary School is organized into color-coded instructional pods to identify the different grade levels
- Middle School is designed to allow teaming in each grade level
- High School offers a wide range of education opportunities with offerings covering vocational as well as college prep
- USD 394 utilized additional federal funds to achieve a district wide 1-1 technology availability. All students have access to a device if they are not already directly assigned a device for daily use
- Laptop computers are provided for high school and middle school students to use at school and home during the school year
- Strong Parents-as-Teachers program
- Latch key Kid's Klub program
- Brand new half-day Three-Year-Old PreK and a half-day Four-Year-Old Pre-School program both with optional daycare
- All Rose Hill USD 394 faculty members are highly qualified per state and federal guidelines



## SCHOOL COMMUNITY

USD 394 encompasses fifty-five square miles in southwest Butler and southeast Sedgwick counties in Kansas. We are a suburban district, located fifteen (15) miles southeast of Wichita. We are over a decade into our second century of educational excellence, which began with the 2009-2010 school year.

Our partnership with Butler Community College provides credit classes for many of our subjects on site during the school day. The creation of several Early College Academies located within Rose Hill High School, allows students the opportunity to graduate with a college Associates Degree.

Additionally, the Orion Diploma Completion Program provides an on-site alternative school for those students who struggle in a traditional secondary education environment as well as offering a virtual option for those who prefer that learning environment. Special Education services are provided by the Butler County Special Education Interlocal, which serves all nine school districts in the county.
