Community Information

USD 452, Stanton County Schools, nestled in rural southwest Kansas, is a district of 690 square miles. As an agriculturally based community, the USD 452 student population is diverse with approximately 58% Hispanic population and 53% At Risk population. The district has a total enrollment of 450 students. The district configuration consists of Stanton County Elementary School (a PreK-6th grade attendance center) and Stanton County Junior/Senior High School that houses students in grades 7-12. The community is fortunate to have seven churches, a museum, a recreation department, a public library, an assisted living center, several restaurants, a nine-hole golf course, an outdoor recreational swimming pool, along with an indoor swimming pool within the Jr./Sr. High School and several locally-owned businesses. The business community includes: a flower shop, a pharmacy, a boutique clothing store, a weekly newspaper, implement dealerships, a grocery store, a hardware store, a convenience store, a variety of restaurants and an auto parts store round out the businesses. A modern, fully-staffed and equipped local hospital is another draw for the Stanton County community. The local economy is boosted by multiple cattle feed yards, cattle dairies, grain elevators, irrigation businesses and a private meat packing company. As in most small, rural communities, school activities play a major role in the vitality of the community and are the center of socialization for the community. USD 452 Stanton County Schools, in conjunction with the Stanton County Recreation Department, Stanton County Library, Stanton County Museum and community businesses, work hard to combine resources and
